

LOW LIGHT PLANTS

All plants require light to survive, however, these no fuss plants can tolerate low light conditions, although they will do *better* with medium light.

Pothos & Philodendron: Very versatile ~ both look great trailing out of a hanging basket, climbing up a pole or other structure, or just left to crawl over a tabletop or mantel.

Sansivieria (Snake Plant): Nearly indestructible with architectural, sword-shaped leaves. Do not overwater otherwise roots will rot.

Zamioculcus zamiifolia (ZZ Plant): The thick, fleshy leafstalks are so durable that you might even think it's plastic. It is a slow grower, so choose a bigger one.

Syngonium podophyllum/Nephtytis (Arrow Plant): The colorful leaves keep their variegation -- even in low-light spots, so this is a top pick for dressing up just about any corner of your home.

Aspidistra elatior (Cast Iron Plant): This plant really lives up to its name ~ It's nearly indestructible. Water infrequently. Nice long upright leaves.

Aglaonema commutatum (Chinese Evergreen): Lovely variegation on leaves brighten up any dark corner. Rarely needs re-potting, but keep evenly moist.

Dieffenbachia: Its large, green and white patterned leaves create a decidedly tropical look to any room of your home.

Peperomia: Its glossy (sometimes colorful) foliage adds great texture to any room -- without taking up a lot of space.

Dracaena fragrans (Corn Plant): Some varieties are more tolerant of low light than others. Nice tall plant for a dim corner. Let dry between waterings.

TIPS FOR SUCCESS: Indoor Plants are typically tropical plants that require growing conditions similar to their native environment. Select a plant whose requirements best suit your room's interior and try to duplicate the light, moisture and temperatures of their natural environment.
